Dear ASCS Families,

I hope that your first week of Advent has been reflective and holy. The students are working hard in preparation for Wednesday's (12/11) Lessons and Carols prayer service which begins at 6:30pm in the church. Students should arrive to their classrooms between 6:00-6:15pm. Student dress code is Christmas best – tops must have sleeves (no bare shoulders). Kindly take your child/ren's coats with you, as we will not return to the classrooms after the performance. PTO is hosting cookies afterward!

NOTE: All K-8 students are required to attend and participate in Lessons and Carols as part of their music curriculum and grade.

Thursday (12/12) is a scheduled 2-Hour Delay. We will offer morning care service for \$5 per student, beginning at 7:30am.

The cold weather definitely has arrived, and students have been reminded that we will go outside for recess if the temperature (w/ windchill) is 20° or higher and to be sure they wear hats, gloves, and appropriate coverage. Girls may wear plain black leggings under their skirts, and may bring flannel pants to wear underneath during recess.
